- any physical or mental injury (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
- the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a disease including but not only COVID-19;

• the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behaviour, course of conduct or

state of affairs:

- that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to you or the community; or
- that may result in harm or disadvantage to you or the community,
- any claim for any costs and expenses you may incur as a consequence of any of the above;
- arising from your participation in or attendance at the Motorsport Activities;

• indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and

• attend at or participate in the Motorsport Activities at your own risk.

You understand that:

• nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that you may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of Motorsport Australia and the Entities as the supplier of the Motorsport Activities and Recreational Services;

• nothing in this document prevents Motorsport Australia and the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability;



SPECTATING OVERVIEW



SPECTATING MUST DO'S

1. Be prepared. Weatherwise bring hats, ground cover, sun screen, and protection in case of rain or cold weather. Some points are at high altitude. Food and drink are not available at spectator points so make sure that you bring your own.

2. Park your car sensibly so that it will not obstruct emergency vehicles, competitors, service crews or other spectators. In all cases obey parking instructions given by signs or officials. It is advisable to park your car facing the way out.

3. Do not try to emulate rally drivers. If you give cause for complaint it will reflect badly on the rally and the sport as a whole. Drive carefully to and from spectator points and be ready to give way to other traffic on narrow stretches of road.

4. If you have to take dogs or young children to spectator points, make sure they are completely under your control and that they do not get in the way of rally cars or mechanics or officials at work.

5. Do not light fires or smoke in the forests. Do not smoke near a car that is being serviced or refueled.6. Keep clear of rally control points at all times from the timing marker to the control. If control officials ask you to move, please help them maintain event safety by doing so. Remember that they have a difficult job to do as it is. If you want to see a control point in action, then stand well back.

7. Rally cars can lose control and leave the road at any time. Do not stand in No Go areas or areas contrary to the advice of this Guide or officials or marshals.

8. The instructions of spectator marshals must be obeyed. They have the power to stop a stage until the spectator point is controlled to their satisfaction.


9. Do not ignore this Spectator Guide and try and find your own way around. The spectator route in this Guide has been surveyed and is safe.

10. Take your litter home. It is handy to have a bag or carton with you. Please leave our forests and rural roads tidy.

11. At service or refuel points do not crowd mechanics when they are working. Besides hindering them, you may get injured.

SPECTATOR WARNING



SERVICE INFORMATION 2

Service Reminders: If speeding by a registered service vehicle is reported by the police to the Clerk of the Course or the Stewards, the Stewards may apply penalties to the related competitor of \$200 fine for first offence, \$500 for second offence and \$1000 for third and subsequent offences. The Competitor is given the opportunity to first offer an explanation to the Stewards. Service Crew personnel must be listed on the entry form with contact details and must sign on at the Book In desk. Servicing by other than driver and co-driver can only occur within the Mitta Mitta Service Park.

We are fortunate to have access to the golf course as our Service Park. Please respect that by avoiding activities that damage the surface of the service area. No waste of any kind is to be left at the service area. All fluids must be drained into appropriate containers for disposal in accordance with EPA regulations.

It is highly recommended service crews have a working fire extinguisher within their service area.


Please ensure that trailers are parked in the area provided, and that non-service vehicles are parked outside the service area. It is important that rally cars have clear unimpeded access within the service park.

Remote Refuel Heat 1:


For those service crews intending to travel to the remote refuel and not make use of the Organiser's fuel transport service, follow the route chart below and allow 1hr 40 minutes each way.

Turn left out of the Service Park past the CFA/SES building 1.4 km turn left at cross roads, over bridge on C544 0.7 km turn right onto Omeo Hwy C543 52.6 km turn right onto Murray Valley Hwy B400 34.4 km turn right onto Avondale Rd 1.2 km keep right on Avondale Rd 0.2 km keep left on Avondale Rd 11.0 km arrive Remote Refuel Zone. Park off road and place fuel in designated area.

Remote Refuel Heat 2:



Service crews must park their vehicle in the nominated areas

Crews must wait outside the bunted refuel area which consists of two parking lanes, until their rally car stops inside the marked lanes.

A crew member or members performing refuelling MUST wear neck to ankle to wrist, non-flammable clothing, hat, eye protection and gloves.

Driver and Co-driver may assist the refuel and both are to be out of the car or if in car, with seatbelts unfastened. Engine to be switched off.

It is recommended that fuel is added to each car by syphon. No work other than refuelling may be performed on the car in the Refuel Zone.

Driver and Codriver may work on the car outside the Refuel Zone.
